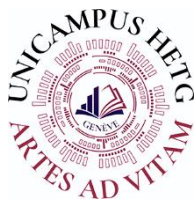

A High School Diploma is required.

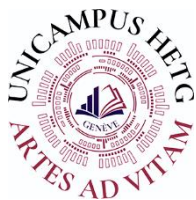
